The purpose of the Alumni Ambassador Groups is to enhance the mission of Regis College and support its institutional priorities. Volunteers work closely with the Office of Institutional Advancement, Alumni Relations, and the Admissions office to build effective programs that serve Regis alumni and the broader community. - Participate in opportunities to gather and enjoy the camaraderie of fellow alumni, faculty, staff and students of Regis.

Expectations

While participation is voluntary, members of each Alumni Ambassador group are expected to:

- Attend meetings and events relevant to their group's focus (in person or via Zoom).
- Attend Regis events (2-3 per year encouraged).
- Fulfill your philanthropic commitment to Regis, \$250 per member annually, \$100 for GOLD (graduate of the last decade) alumni. With a goal of achieving 100% participation among volunteers.
- Attend annual Alumni Ambassador volunteer gathering each Fall.

Volunteer Groups and Focus Areas

- **Admissions, Engagement, GOLD, and First-Generation Ambassadors**
 - o Focus: Actively engaging alumni, promoting university events, increasing GOLD (Graduates of the Last Decade) attendance, partnering with Admissions to enhance Regis' visibility.
 - o Activities: Recruitment and orientation of new members, diversifying the Alumni Volunteer Groups.
- **Career Services/Mentorship Ambassadors**
 - o Focus: Supporting career development for students and alumni through mentoring, internships, and networking. Support and attend career development events, namely, RWN events and those hosted by the Center for Internships and Career Development.
 - o Activities: Supporting RWN mentorship program, attending career-focused events, promoting job and internship opportunities, and enhancing Regis' presence on LinkedIn.
- **Philanthropy Ambassadors**
 - o Focus: Supporting fundraising goals through outreach and engagement.
 - o Activities: Assisting with key fundraising events, recruiting and stewarding class agents, and promoting philanthropy among alumni.
 - o Giving Day, Reunion class, and fiscal year end (June) outreach critical to success of this effort
- **Sustainer Ambassadors**
 - o The Alumni Ambassador Sustainer Group is comprised of members who have served two consecutive active terms. As a sustainer, a member may remain as active and engaged as they wish, including attending the fall meeting, events, etc but attendance at events and meetings along with serving on a committee is no longer a requirement.

Group Leadership

Each Volunteer Group will have a Lead Ambassador; appointed by the Office of Institutional Advancement. The Lead Ambassador is responsible for articulating and carrying out the group's vision, mission, and goals, planning and facilitating meetings, and ensuring members adhere to their group's focus.

All volunteers granted access to giving records and contact information must use this information solely for conducting business on behalf of Regis College. Such information is confidential and must not be shared or used for personal solicitation. Volunteers will sign a confidentiality agreement prior to the September kick-off meeting each year.
